Population	<i>Nursing Students of the Greek Pilot Course in Family & Community Nursing– Online Life Long Learning Programme.</i>	
Contents	<p><i>You are working as a family & community nurse (FCN) within a community palliative care team. You are carrying approximately 20 people, who experience serious illness such as cancer & end of life diseases. You work with people at home and you assess their health and social care needs, you plan and deliver care, promote recovery and quality of life through a variety of interventions and you evaluate their effectiveness.</i></p> <p><i>John is a 27 years’ man, diagnosed with advanced cancer. During the last days John expressed several times to you his willing to die. He is asking for your help, mentioning to you not to say anything to the other family members.</i></p>

Phase 1	Task	<i>Search resources about ethics in your country concerning patients’ confidentiality, suicidal ideation & euthanasia in end of life patients. Write an assignment (200-250 words) describing what will you do.</i>

Self-regulated learning	<p><i>Plenary session - Please describe</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>What is your previous knowledge about ethics and professional standards in palliative nursing care and euthanasia?</i> <p><i>For the activity itself, please decide:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>In which of the aspects that proposed before you would like to deepen (please chose among contents)</i> - <i>Which kind of assignment you want to deliver (a written assignment, a video with conclusions, a concept map, etc)</i> <p><i>For the 4Ts behaviour:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Consume: Study the learning material about ethics and professional standards that are in OOT;</i> - <i>Create: Submit the final version of your artefact for being reviewed by the teacher within 15 days;</i> - <i>Contribute: Share within the students' community the final version of your artefact at the end of the whole process;</i> - <i>Connect: Discuss with the other members of the team in the forum about your decisions.</i>
